The Innovation Track is a dual enrollment program that offers students the opportunity to earn up to 30 hours of college credit taken on the Metropolitan Community College, Longview Campus. Courses taken through the Innovation Track count for both high school and college credit.

The program works in partnership with Metropolitan Community College and University of Central Missouri to provide seamless transition to the institutions following graduation from high school. College credits taken through the Innovation Track have ease of transferability to all Missouri public two- and four-year institutions of higher education per **CORE 42** (MO Department of Higher Education)

*****Tuition rate of \$51.50 per credit hour plus the cost of textbooks and fees. Tuition and textbook assistance available for qualifying students.**

- Students in grades 11 or 12
- Minimum 2.5 GPA
- Qualifying ACT/Accuplacer score (per MCC course enrollment requirements)
- Innovation Track and MCC Application
