WHAT IS A CREDIT?

 Credits are earned as a student passes a class in high school

 1/2 credit is earned per semester for each class

 Credits are required in several subject areas in order to graduate



- 10 hours of Community Service
 - May begin after 8th grade
 - All projects must be
 - pre-approved
 - Pass a US Citizenship Test
 - American History
- Pass U.S. & MO Constitution Tests
 - American Government
- Participate in 30 minutes of CPR
 - Foundations of Fitness













COMMUNICATION ARTS

- 4 credits required for graduation
- Required course each year

English 9	1 credit
Advanced Studies English 9	1 credit



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MATHEMATICS

- 3 credits required for graduation
- Required course for all freshmen Immediate Choices:

Pre-Algebra	1 credit
Algebra 1	1 credit
Geometry	1 credit
Advanced Studies Geometry	1 credit
AMPED on Algebra/Business	2 credits*
Geometry in Construction	2 credits*

* Counts as 1 Math credit and 1 Practical Art



MATHEMATICS

- Algebra 1 taken in 8th grade will count for H.S. credit, and will meet college requirement
- To reach Calculus, students must enroll in Geometry during 9th grade.







SOCIAL STUDIES

• 3 credits required for graduation

• Required course for all freshmen





American History	1 credit
Advanced American History	1 credit













SCIENCE

• 3 credits required for graduation

Required course for all freshmen

Immediate Choices:

Biology	1 credit
Advanced Studies Biology	1 credit











FINE ARTS

- 1 credit required for graduation
- 1 credit = 1 year-long course or
 - 2 semester-long courses
- Courses may be taken from the following areas:
 Art
 Music
 Theatre











PRACTICAL ARTS

- 1 credit required for graduation
- Courses may be taken from the following areas:

Business

Family and Consumer Sciences (FACS)

Engineering & Industrial Technology











PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- 1 credit required for graduation
- Must take Foundations of Fitness
- 2nd credit can be any other PE elective

If your student wants to take Adv. Strength and Performance Sophomore -Senior year, Freshman must take Foundations of Fitness and Strength and Performance









HEALTH

- Health & Family Education is required for graduation
- Often taken by freshmen





- Taken for elective credit only
- Modern Language taken in 8th grade will count for H.S. credit, and will meet college admission if required
- Some colleges require two years of the same modern language. Check with individual colleges for specific requirements



LEARNING LABS

- Learning Labs are optional
- Students are expected to work on academic subjects.
- Increased academic success



 <u>A learning lab does not count for</u> <u>credit</u>

COURSE SELECTION PROCESS


- LSHS Counselors are visiting PLMS and ETMS on Feb 5th

 - Required parent/student meeting with LSHS Academic Coach on February 26th and 27th to finalize requests











SCHEDULE BUILDING PROCESS

- LSHS Master Schedule is based upon student requests
- Highest number of students possible are placed in requested courses including alternates if needed
- Students receive schedule prior to start of school
- Imperative that students choose wisely!
- Alternates need to be classes of interest
- Schedule changes will not be granted











In- Person and Online Course Options

- Students may choose to take in-person or online courses for many LSR7 classes
 - Highly recommend online ONLY for students 10-12 who experienced success with virtual learning in the past
- Students may take 1-7 online classes
- Must have transportation on/off campus during online classes

A+ PROGRAM

- State funded program to encourage post-secondary education
- Up to two years of full tuition assistance for full-time students to any public Missouri community college or technical school
- Some 4-year colleges recognize the A+ certificate with scholarships
- Students must apply for the program and meet certain guidelines



A+ REQUIREMENTS

- Attend an A+ School for 3 consecutive years (10, 11, 12) prior to graduation
- Graduate with an unweighted cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher and 95% attendance
 - Qualifying score on an approved math exam
- Perform 50 hours of unpaid tutoring or mentoring to students
- Good Citizenship Students suspended 10 days or more are ineligible.





IB Program:

The International Baccalaureate (IB) program is a globally recognized, rigorous academic curriculum designed to develop well-rounded students into critical thinkers, global citizens, and lifelong learners, emphasizing intercultural understanding and preparing them for university success through challenging coursework across multiple subject areas.

Advanced Placement courses

The Advanced Placement Program (AP) enables willing and academically prepared students to pursue **college**-level studies while still in high school.

Advanced Studies Pathway Room 2209

- Available in 9th and 10th grades
- Carry a weight of .5
- Developing students; not perfect students
- Any student planning to further his/her education after high school
- Students with a strong interest or aptitude in a particular subject







Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA) Room 2205

- All freshmen enter as eligible
- Passed at least 6 classes, (3.0 credits) in preceding semester
- Enrolled in at least 6 classes (3.0 credits) during semester of participation
